



October 14, 2020 – Fall Remote and Hybrid Feedback Results

We received over 250 responses to the Fall Remote and Hybrid Feedback survey that was sent out to all secondary parents and posted on the district website. Please see the results of the survey below. Secondary principals will work with their faculty to review the data and develop action plans targeting the neediest areas. Principals have also sought student and faculty feedback to inform their work to develop the strongest instruction possible for the new hybrid and remote formats. Using multiple sources (e.g., students, parents, faculty), our intention is to provide the highest quality instruction leading to engaging all students in the learning process at all levels.

The results below represent the average point score on each of the statements (1 is the lowest, 5 is the highest).

Statement #1: My child has learned the daily routines of the classroom and he/she consistently knows what is expected in their remote classes. Average rating: 3.78

Statement #2: My child consistently uses technology to watch live instruction, ask questions, and receive support while learning new skills and content. Average rating: 3.49

Statement #3: My child has multiple opportunities to communicate with his or her teacher to share what is difficult or any concerns both in large class and independently. Average rating: 3.72

Statement #4: On a daily basis, my child has "Too little, Just right, Too much" work assigned to complete independently. Average: 67% of respondents selected just right.

Statement #5: My child is provided an adequate amount of time to complete assignments and the workload is evenly distributed. Average rating: 3.90

Statement #6: My child interacts with other students and the teacher using technology tools. Average rating: 3.08

Statement #7: My child receives feedback from his or her teacher which is then used to guide or improve my child's learning. Average rating: 3.46

Statement #8: My child uses a variety of technology tools to stay engaged with his or her classroom and learning. Average rating: 3.55

55% of respondents indicated the new hybrid or remote instruction is meeting or exceeding their expectations so far.

Principals are in the process of developing action plans in response to input from multiple sources. We intend to reach out to parents and guardians with the same survey a few months from now to help chart our course in this new way of teaching and learning. Thank you for your feedback and we look forward to developing action plans and hearing back from you in the future. With your help, we intend to be an instructional leader in secondary schools across the region and state.
